# Thoughts on the March 30th Youth Unity Shabbat at Temple Emanuel by William Gross

Over the years, as I attended Sunday morning services at African American churches for work-related programs, I felt the passion of the music and songs that are the foundation of their worship. Often, I wondered what would it be like to have a Shabbat service with this energy? Now I know.

On Saturday, March 30, some 100 African American Jewish youth and adults had a rousing celebration of Shabbat in our sanctuary. They came to Gastonia from congregations in North Carolina and nearby states, at the invitation of our member Rabbi Ya'aqov Walker.

Worship began at noon, primarily led by teens and young adults, featuring joyous and uplifting drumming and song.

Mark Epstein, Lisa Jenkins, Honna Miller, Peter Blau, Stephanie Rauch, and Glenn Silverman served as hosts from our Temple and attended portions of the service, which ran three hours and then another two after a midday break.

Our guests loved the sanctuary and the history of our nearly 100-year-old building and are discussing renting our building again for another Shabbat celebration. If these plans come together, please join us for a Shabbat service unlike any you've ever attended.



And, to make the Shabbat even sweeter, the preceding evening

– at our Friday night services led by Rabbi Walker – we participated in the Bar Mitzvah service of Ezra Tzaddiyq Ben Yisrael, from the Rabbi's shul in Charlotte. The evening started with a delicious vegan dinner hosted by Ezra's mother and was capped with Ezra beautifully reading the Torah and Haftorah portion for parashat Tzav.
