From Abram to Abraham:



Click here to watch an informative and genuinely engaging video for kids about Abraham. The video explores why G-d chose Abraham to יְּלְּהָרְ "lech lecha" ("Get going!", as Rabbi Marx translated it). After watching the video, ask your children to explain what our teaching in *Pirkei Avot* 1:5 means: "Let your house be open wide." They'll be able to do it!



Pirkei Avot, Ethics (or Chapters) of the Fathers, is a compilation of the ethical teachings and maxims from Rabbinic Jewish tradition. It is found in the Mishnah, the code of Jewish law compiled in the early 3rd century CE.

From the Jewish Community Relations Council's "Action Dispatch":

While still acknowledging the tragic suffering of the Palestinian people, to equip our community with the tools and knowledge needed to combat misinformation and disinformation, Jewish Federation

of Greater Charlotte suggests that we arm ourselves with accurate information and expert insights, so that we are better equipped to respond to the rise in antisemitism and to stand up for Israel in an informed and meaningful way.

Sources of information:

- Explore the <u>Israel Facts</u>, <u>Not Fiction</u> webpage, curated by the Jewish United Fund of Chicago to fight the fiction and misinformation that has been running rampant since October 7.
- Fact-check your news using this <u>Media Literacy Guide</u>, created by Jewish Democracy. Remember, misinformation is everywhere, even in commonly trusted news outlets.
- Read and share the <u>open letter</u> where the American Jewish Committee (AJC) and Jewish Federations of North America (JFNA) call out media organizations for continued flaws in Israel coverage.
- Make your voice heard. For too long, media outlets have inadequately covered stories about Israel, putting the Jewish state, Israelis, and Jews around the world at risk. Join the AJC and JFNA in calling on the media to start reporting honestly.
