Dear Temple Emanuel Family,

We are pleased to announce our next step to secure a part-time rabbi. Rabbi (and Cantor!) Jacquie Marx will join us for the remainder of this fiscal year, spending a weekend with us in February, March and April.

Rabbi Marx is the next spiritual leader in the "Rabbinic history" of Temple Emanuel. Many of you know Dr. Charlie Brown led our services for nearly 25 years. Although not ordained, he was our much-loved Rabbi in all but name. Several years ago Charlie decided it was time to enter semi-retirement -- semi because, to our good fortune, he continues to lead our High Holiday services, Pesach Seder, and occasionally other ritual events.

When Charlie stepped down, several of our dedicated and skilled members stepped forward to take the reins. Since then Bill Marx, Bill Gross, Mark Epstein, Ya'akov Walker (now Rabbi Walker), Ya'akov Simmons and Lee Buchanan have lay-led our Shabbat services, never missing a Friday.

Now, we celebrate the addition of Rabbi Marx to our Temple family. During her weekend visits she will lead Shabbat services on Fridays; conduct adult and youth education on Saturdays; and co-lead religious school activities with Morah Rochelle Wilensky on Sundays. Rabbi Marx will also coach our bar and bat mitzvah students on Sundays.



#### From the Jewish Community Relations Council's "Action Dispatch":

While still acknowledging the tragic suffering of the Palestinian people, to equip our community with the tools and knowledge needed to combat misinformation and disinformation, Jewish Federation of Greater Charlotte suggests that we arm ourselves with accurate information and expert insights, so that we are better equipped to respond to the rise in antisemitism and to stand up for Israel in an informed and meaningful way.

Sources of information:

- Explore the <u>Israel Facts, Not Fiction</u> webpage, curated by the Jewish United Fund of Chicago to fight the fiction and misinformation that has been running rampant since October 7.
- Fact-check your news using this <u>Media Literacy Guide</u>, created by Jewish Democracy. Remember, misinformation is everywhere, even in commonly trusted news outlets.
- Read and share the <u>open letter</u> where the American Jewish Committee (AJC) and Jewish Federations of North America (JFNA) call out media organizations for continued flaws in Israel coverage.
- <u>Make your voice heard.</u> For too long, media outlets have inadequately covered stories about Israel, putting the Jewish state, Israelis, and Jews around the world at risk. Join the AJC and JFNA in calling on the media to start reporting honestly.
