


#### Hey and the Divine Presence

According to one midrash, yod left aleph to become part of dalet, thus forming hey. Since aleph represents G-d and dalet represents broken humanity, hey is a picture of the presence of G-d within the human heart. This function of hey can be seen when Abram was renamed Abraham and Sarai was renamed Sarah.

#### Hey is for Abraham Joshua Heschel, 1907-1972

Born in Warsaw, Poland, Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel was one of the most famous Jewish theologians of the 20th century. Having arrived in America in 1940, Heschel was a professor of Jewish mysticism at the Jewish Theological Seminary of America and wrote a number of widely read books on Jewish philosophy.

Heschel believed that the teachings of the Hebrew prophets were a call for social action in the United States. Inspired by this belief, he worked for African American civil rights. After participating in the third Selma to Montgomery march, he famously observed, "My feet were praying." Martin Luther King called Heschel "a truly great prophet." Rabbi Heschel also spoke out against the Vietnam War. And, at the Second Vatican Council, Heschel persuaded the Catholic Church to end nearly two millennia of hostility against Jews and Judaism.







#### From the Jewish Community Relations Council's "Action Dispatch":

While still acknowledging the tragic suffering of the Palestinian people, to equip our community with the tools and knowledge needed to combat misinformation and disinformation, Jewish Federation of Greater Charlotte suggests that we arm ourselves with accurate information and expert insights, so that we are better equipped to respond to the rise in antisemitism and to stand up for Israel in an informed and meaningful way.

Sources of information:

- Explore the Israel Facts, Not Fiction webpage, curated by the Jewish United Fund of Chicago to fight the fiction and misinformation that has been running rampant since October 7.
- Fact-check your news using this Media Literacy Guide, created by Jewish Democracy. Remember, misinformation is everywhere, even in commonly trusted news outlets.
- Read and share the open letter where the American Jewish Committee (AJC) and Jewish Federations of North America (JFNA) call out media organizations for continued flaws in Israel coverage.
- Make your voice heard. For too long, media outlets have inadequately covered stories about Israel, putting the Jewish state, Israelis, and Jews around the world at risk. Join the AJC and JFNA in calling on the media to start reporting honestly.
