Security

Sheriff's deputies will be at all services. One will be at the side entrance and will then patrol the street outside the Temple. The second will be at our main entrance and then in the sanctuary.

How to Have a Loved One's Name Read Aloud During Yizkor

In order to have a name read out during the Yizkor service one of three things needs to happen:

- 1. Purchase a nameplate for \$250 with your loved one's name and date of death, which will be added to a Memorial Plaque in the sanctuary. Please email katieneedell@gmail.com to order a nameplate (be sure to include the dates of death and birth). Once your loved one has a nameplate their name will be read out during the Yizkor service automatically from year to year.
- 2. Purchase either a page for up to five loved ones' names in the Temple's Book of Life for \$150 or add a single name to the Book of Life for \$50. Names in the Book of Life are automatically read from year to year during Yizkor. Email <u>Temple Emanuel</u> to purchase a page or add a single name.
- 3. Prior to Yom Kippur, you may make a contribution of \$18 per name in order to have a loved one's name read during Yizkor. Those who choose this option must resubmit their loved one's name every year in order to have it read at Yizkor. Please email Temple Emanuel if you choose this option.




Caring For Congregants


