

An important message from Morah Rochelle Wilensky, Director of our Religious School

"Last winter Activities Director Suzi Nash and I sponsored Mitzvah Day on a Sunday morning. Those who attended – congregants, religious school students and their families – made cards sending love and support to the family of David Cunio, a hostage being held in Gaza by Hamas.



A dear friend of mine is the best friend of David's wife, Sharon. Sharon, and their twin daughters Emma and Yuli (then three years old), had also all been taken hostage. Sharon and the twins were released after 51 days, but on Mitzvah Day David was still a prisoner in Gaza.

I am so very pleased to be able to announce that David was among the 20 still-living hostages recently released from Gaza. He has been reunited with Sharon and the twins, and they are finally once again a family of four - together.

David has a long physical and psychological recovery ahead, but he is overjoyed to be home. I do believe that the prayers and cards of those who attended Mitzvah Day helped his family through their agonizing wait for their husband and father to come home.

Suzi and I sincerely hope that you join us on Mitzvah Day in January 2026, when we will all have another opportunity to put our hearts and minds together to help others." Signed, *Morah Rochelle*


Caring For Congregants

A Second Conversion Class bat Temple Emanuel!

Our second conversion class has started its course of study. Students first take the Union of Reform Judaism's <u>online course</u>. They then attend class with our own Rabbi Yaaqov Walker (and occasionally other Temple Emanuel instructors) every 1-2 Sunday mornings. They also will learn Hebrew reading skills with congregant and lay leader Bill Marx. Once study is complete, around the spring of 2026, students will participate in a Beit Din and Conservative conversion at Temple Israel in Charlotte.


This course will be taught by Rabbi Judy Schindler and Judy LaPietra. It will be offered in person (with a Zoom link and recording for those who are traveling).


