

### **Conversion at Temple Emanuel!**

Our second conversion class has started its course of study. Students first take the Union of Reform Judaism's <u>online course</u>. They then attend class with our own Rabbi Yaaqov Walker (and occasionally other Temple Emanuel instructors) every 1-2 Sunday mornings. They also will learn Hebrew reading skills with congregant and lay leader Bill Marx. Once study is complete, around the spring of 2026, students will participate in a Beit Din and Conservative conversion at Temple Israel in Charlotte.





# Upcoming Community Events in the Greater Gaston Area: Learn, Participate, Celebrate, Support

Several years ago Temple Emanuel co-sponsored a program at Queens University on Nostra Aetate, more widely known as Vatican II. It was a terrific program.


Our friends at Queens are reprising this topic with a free program celebrating the 60th Anniversary of this seminal document, which rejected Catholic antisemitism and hatred of other religions.

Nostra Aetate formally reversed almost 2000 years of theologic animosity between Christians and Jews, and was followed by Protestant denominations in the 1970s. It declares Jews are very dear to God: "God does not take back the gifts He bestowed or the choice He made. Jews are not rejected or cursed by God because of the death of Jesus: neither all Jews then, nor any Jew today, can be blamed for the death of Jesus. The Church deplores all hatred and antisemitism."

ELEANOR THE GREAT is Scarlett Johansson's directorial debut, starring June Squibb as a witty but troubled 94-year-old, Eleanor Morgenstein, who moves to New York City after the death of her lifelong best friend. Seeking connection, she befriends a young student, Nina (Erin Kellyman), but then tells a story that isn't hers, a tale she claims is from her Holocaust survivor past, which takes on a dangerous life of its own. The film is a comically poignant exploration of grief, friendship, and the stories we tell, with actual Holocaust survivors appearing in supporting roles to add authenticity.


